



Mich. soldier killed in 2010 subject of new film

ROYAL OAK, Mich. (AP) - A Michigan soldier who was killed during fighting in Afghanistan in 2010 is the subject of a new film that's making its debut this month.

Twenty-3-year-old Michael K. Ingram Jr. of Newport died while on patrol in Kandahar when an improvised explosive detonated near him.

On June 29, a procession of Patriot Guard riders will gather in his honor in Royal Oak for the debut of "One Soldier's Story." The one-hour documentary by Keith Famie and Visionalist Entertainment Productions tells the story of Ingram and his family.

Ingram, an Army corporal, was promoted to sergeant upon his death.

The Daily Tribune of Royal Oak reports the premiere also will introduce the public to Mikie's Minutes, a charity created by Ingram's family.
